COFFEE: THE STUDENT'S DRINK OF CHOICE

With midterms in full swing, many students are finding solace in the consumption of a certain caffeinepacked beverage: coffee. Though the utilization of coffee for its stimulating effects has been around for ages, the mechanisms underlying these effects are still actively under investigation. A simple question emerges from this realization: Is it beneficial for students to consume coffee in preparation for exams?

Well, it turns out that this simple question is actually quite complex. Scientists studying the health effects of coffee often come to conflicting conclusions. How then, can we classify the effects of coffee consumption as generally positive or negative? In order to effectively answer this question, one must weigh the corresponding pros and cons of coffee consumption.

Let's start out with the benefits. Perhaps the most important of all the aspects of coffee consumption is the factor of taste. There is an obvious relationship between mood and the consumption of something with a pleasing flavor. Thus, it follows that one who enjoys drinking coffee will benefit from the consumption – at least in the short term – on a psychological level (with potential boosts in academic performance).

Those that are indifferent to the coffee flavor would not benefit in this way from consumption. Those that dislike the flavor would likewise not benefit, but most likely due to the fact that they will choose not to consume coffee in the first place; some people in the latter two categories may choose to drown the coffee in other substances – such as milk, sugar, and artificial flavor additives – to make it more palatable. In this case, they may benefit from consumption just as much as those who enjoy the pure taste of coffee.

In addition to taste satisfaction, there are also biological benefits to coffee consumption. Caffeine, a well-known stimulant, is one of the most abundant substances in coffee; it is usually present on the order of 107-151 mg in a standard cup. After being absorbed by the stomach and intestines, caffeine disperses throughout the body.

At this point, caffeine can affect the body in a variety of ways; the most notable effect occurs in the brain. Caffeine targets structures called adenosine receptors. When caffeine binds to these receptors, it blocks adenosine from being able to bind as it normally would. Since adenosine dampens brain activity when bound to the receptor, caffeine intake can stimulate heightened brain activity.

With heightened cognitive capacity, one could certainly experience an enhanced ability for memory and recall. These stimulating effects also contribute to coffee's ability to counter grogginess. Consequently, coffee can be helpful to students who have trouble staying up to study or waking up for exams.

As with most things in life, too much of a good thing can often have negative consequences. Although moderate coffee consumption – around 3–4 cups a day – can increase mental activity, high consumption can lead to over-stimulation. This corresponds to hyperactivity, jitteriness, inability to focus, and restlessness. These effects would detract from one's ability to study for or take an exam.

NNU ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR A LEARNING COMMONS

For many people, college is a time for growing, making friends, and making memories. It is also, and I may argue more importantly, a time for academic development. After all, the one tangible item that all graduates take away from college is a degree. Successfully earning a degree requires an active engagement in the learning process. This commitment can be tested when we struggle with challenging courses, or when we simply can't find a good place to study.

Our University is devoted to the success of its students, and it constantly strives to offer resources that facilitate active learning. In response to a growing need for academic support and additional resources, NNU has announced that construction for a new Learning Commons will begin on March 8th of this year. The building is scheduled to open in the fall of 2014.

Although conceptual planning began in 2008, sufficient funds for construction did not become available until this fall. With a \$4.6 million grant from the J.A. and Kathryn Albertson Foundation, NNU can now seriously pursue this long awaited addition to campus. Along with jump-starting construction on the Learning Commons, the funds were granted to the University to establish the NNU Center of Innovation in Teaching and Learning. This center will provide support for teachers – NNU faculty and areawide educators – in using technology and assessing its effectiveness in the classroom. Construction of the Learning Commons will add around 35,000 square feet to the existing Riley Library, almost tripling its size. The interior of the current library will be completely remodeled in the building process. In addition, the circle drive and University Boulevard (the section in front of Brandt Center lawn) will be converted into grass.

The Learning Commons will be multifunctional, serving as a library and a center for many campus resources. In fact, many existing resources will be relocating to the Learning Commons. These include the Academic Support Center (ASC), Academic Advising and Testing, E-Learning Services, and Technology and Media Resources (TMR). With so many academic resources in one location, students may find it easier to obtain the help they need.

Dr. Sharon Bull, Dean of Learning Resources and Riley Library Director, is particularly excited about this centralization of resources: "The main lobby will have a service center, where students can come with questions and be directed to the appropriate resource. If they need help writing a paper, we will send them to meet with a writing tutor. If they are having computer problems, we will send them to TMR. If they need help doing research, we will send them to one of our librarians." This integration of multiple services into one building will prove advantageous for future students.

SEALAND- A COUNTRY SMALLER THAN A FOOTBALL FIELD

War II, Sealand was supposed to be placed within the 3 mile territorial radius. For reasons unknown, however, it was developed 7 miles away from the coast, placing it in international waters.

This man made island-platform was used during the war, but shortly after was abandoned. The platform should have been deconstructed as was planned, but somehow escaped the deconstruction process. At one point it even had its own passport, however, the royal family, not too appreciative of how freely their passports were being sold and distributed, decided to stop the issuing of passports altogether. There are 27 people living on board the platform, (History).



In 1978, a man named Alexander Achenbach and a few of his associate invaded Sealand while Bates and his wife were away. Attempting to take control of Sealand, Alexander took Bate's son Michael hostage. However, Bates returned and retook his country in a helicopter raid. In the process he took Alexander prisoner until German diplomats freed the man (Phillips and Yardley).

Subsequently, the country of Sealand caught fire on June 23rd of 2006 (Sealand). In this tragedy, a security guard was airlifted to a hospital, and twenty firefighters were recruited to help out at the scene (Sealand). As a result, on the following day at 23:15 the family pledged to rebuild Sealand, literally. On the October 9th of this year, Bates passed away and appointed his son as heir to the throne (Phillips).

PALESTINE, ISRAEL, EGYPT, OH MY

On November 29, 1947, the UN voted to partition Palestine. The Jewish nationalists were officially given a homeland and the state of Israel has since grown in size from the small portion of Western Palestine originally mandated them.

On November 29, 2012, the UN voted to recognize Palestine as a non-member observer state of that body. Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas submitted the candidacy of that nation on behalf of Fatah, one of two groups fighting within Palestine. The move could be beneficial for Assad in regaining some authority, even with Fatah's adversary, Hamas, which has been receiving sympathy as the target of recent Israeli rockets. Hamas mainly occupies Gaza, and it has been the stronger party of the two in recent history.

The Israelis, whose land mass has increased greatly since the 1947 allotment, have qualms about a decision that will give Palestine authority in the UN to charge Israel for their war-won land, their settlements in Gaza, or various other issues. However, moves of this kind are more likely to disturb the peace process than assist it. Assad has announced his intentions of using statehood to negotiate better with Israel, but when Palestine is divided in two warring factions, the legitimacy of any discussion with one administration presuming to speak for two is marred.

On November 14, Israel mobilized its troops and launched an eight-day offensive that ended in a ceasefire. Mobilization of troops is a very expensive, not to mention alarming move they haven't made since 2009, despite multiple rocket attacks by Hamas since then. What preceded this act of Israeli aggression toward Palestine?

These two nations, one just a few days old, aren't the only two involved here. Israel blockaded their southern border after the 2007 events with Hamas, but smuggling ensued that has led to "secret tunnels" between Egypt and Gaza. Among items being smuggled into Gaza are Fjar-5 rockets, long-range, high payload missiles with serious damage potential, likely coming from Iran, which contributed to Israel's offensive movement. Egypt's secular leader Hosni Mubarak wasn't friendly to Hamas; the emerging leadership of the Muslim Brotherhood is. Current Egyptian president, Muhammad Morsi, made recent moves that overstepped his bounds in a supposed democracy on the same day that Palestine was recognized in the UN; what this bodes for Israel, and for that matter the entire region, is still up in the air.
