










Surprise! The team taught an English class, and before they arrived, they had no idea what they would be doing.

But in spite of their austere circumstances, the people in Goma displayed a spirit and love for God that humbled and amazed the Trevecca students.







The men's basketball team had

an outstanding season that included big wins over nationally ranked teams.

Pre-conference-season wins over Illinois-Springfield, Simon Fraser, and Vorhees College gave the team confidence and started the men on an eight-game win streak. Before the season ended the team produced other exciting victories in games against Crichton College (pre-season nationally ranked #2), the University of the Cumberland, Cumberland University, and Freed Hardeman. After losing twice to Martin Methodist, the team proved its mettle by defeating Martin in the semi-final game of the TranSouth Conference Tournament. The men made their third Sweet Sixteen appearance at the NAIA National Tournament, ending the season with a two-point loss to Georgetown.

Their positive performances earned team members significant awards. Josh Helton was named to the NAIA All-National Tournament Team. Josh and Collins Onyando earned All-American honorable mentions. Josh and Collins were also named to the TranSouth Athletic Conference (TSAC) First Team, and Jeremy Dixon was named to the TSAC All-Freshman Team. Christopher Harris was named NAIA Scholar-Athlete, and Adam Drake, Matthew Elliott, and Christopher Harris won TSAC Student-Athlete Awards. Matt Elliott won the Most Improved Player Award; Josh Helton and Collins Onyando were named Co-Most Valuable Players.

Four members of the team earned places in the elite 1,000-Point Club during the 2007-2008 season: Josh Helton; Collins Onyando; Marcos Salvi; and Brian Oduor, who joined that group during his junior year. Brian also led the nation in field-goal percentage. In addition to these individual honors, the team led the NAIA in two categories: field-goal percentage and three-point percentage.

The win over Blue Mountain College on January 28, 2008, was a big win for Head Coach Sam Harris, his 400th win as a coach. This year Harris completed his eighth consecutive winning season and his fourth 20-win season.






# Men's Golf






